Introduction (01 mark)

In educational settings, these norms strongly influence how students participate in classroom activities. Understanding this influence is essential because effective lesson planning can address cultural differences and promote inclusive participation.

How Cultural Norms Influence Student Participation

Students' willingness to participate is shaped by cultural expectations regarding behavior, communication, and learning.

Attitudes toward authority and teachers (02 marks)

Gender roles and expectations (02 marks)

Cultural norms related to gender can influence who speaks and how often, particularly in mixed-gender classrooms. Social expectations may limit participation for some students.

Fear of making mistakes (02 marks)

In cultures where mistakes are viewed negatively, students may fear embarrassment and avoid speaking, leading to passive learning behaviors.

Impact of Cultural Norms on Classroom Interaction (01 marks)

Cultural differences can result in unequal participation, misunderstandings, and reliance on a few outspoken students, making fair assessment challenging.

How Lesson Planning Can Address Cultural Differences

Varied participation strategies (02 marks)
